Prof. Mikaela Huntzinger (Mika-sensei) mainly taught us how to pronounce English sounds (F-V, R-L, TH, schwa sound, etc.), which Japanese people are not particularly good at. Mika-sensei also taught me subtle nuances and tips that we could not get from videos or articles on the Internet. As a result, my listening skills have also improved greatly, for example, it has become easier to distinguish between R and L sounds. Mika-sensei also especially emphasized regarding pronunciation was the understanding of syllables. By carefully understanding these syllables, we could clearly convey technical terms that were difficult to be understood by ordinary people. In addition, I received advice on how to structure my poster and oral presentations. Finally, together with the participating students, we gave a presentation in English and received timely feedback from her on pronunciation, phrasing, and structure. Through these lessons with a native English speaker, I was able to gain confidence in my own English conversation ability and gain the problems that many Japanese people face, which I believe will have a great effect on my future English learning activity. There is no doubt that the lessons I learned in this lesson will be an extremely valuable opportunity in my future life as a researcher.
